OP Nandrajog joined PPS in 1960 along with his younger brother **Vijay Prakash Nandrajog (B-27)**. Passed out in 1963 after completing Senior Cambridge and joined National Defence Academy in Jan 64. Commissioned into 4 GUARDS in Dec 67. Luminary of Defence Services Staff College and National Defence College. Held

prestigious staff and command appointments including Military Attaché and Brigade Commander, Kargil brigade.

In PPS, **General Nandrajog** is remembered for his uncompromising and steadfast devotion to duty, which he pursued rather stubbornly. He possessed a genial nature with a tough exterior and Never Say Die spirit.

In NDA, **Gen. Nandrajog** became some sort of a legend. His favourite commands and punishments were often recalled to later batches of ONs. In NDA, PPS came to be identified with **Gen. Nandrajog**.

PPS – Indian Hockey – KDS Babu

During our impressionable years as students in PPS, there were some remarkable textbook passages, which left a strong and indelible mark on our psyche and perception. One such passage was from our Hindi Text book “Bal Bharti” (published by NCERT) (Class VII-VIII) written on Indian Hockey by Kunwar Digvijay Singh “Babu”.

From this Chapter we learnt, for the first time, of the glorious and world dominating stature Indian Hockey had had in the past. The passage mentioned of the remarkable Indian victories in Helsinki and Amsterdam Olympics under the captaincy of the writer. This greatly touched our patriotism. We could closely share the emotions and the pride of the writer.

The passage in fact changed our very perception of Indian Hockey, which during those years (early 1970s) was sadly, en route, its downhill ride. While in school, we hoped and prayed for return of “Babu” days. (We were given Preps off to listen in our Common Rooms to the radio commentary of Olympic/World Cup fixtures).

While in college (late 1970s), one morning as I picked up the newspaper, we learnt of the suicide by K.D.S. “Babu”. We were absolutely stunned. For us it was like the final whistle. We had lost our faith.

Occasionally some hope, however briefly, is rekindled whenever there is a flicker of brilliance in Indian Hockey. We still pray and hope for the “Babu” days partly for our country sake and partly for giving peace to the tormented soul of one of our School Text book writers, Kunwar Digvijay Singh “Babu”.

Pride hath a fall

Mountainous treks are part of public schools calendar. They help foster spirit of adventure, love and respect for Nature and a sense of comradeship. I am sure all of us have been part of such trips in PPS. All of us also have some sweet memories of an odd happening, a hilarious experience or a dangerous moment on such treks.

I remember one such incident in the year 1964. The trek was in Chamba hills. After a strenuous trek we put up in a remote forest lodge. It had no facilities so we spent the cold night on the floor.

Next morning as we stepped out we saw snow on a mountain peak next to the lodge. All of us decided to go and play with snow.

After a quite breakfast we set up hill. There was no track leading to the top of that mountain so we had to make our way through bush and the jungle. I remember **Rupinder Dhillon (Khilji) (B-68)** carrying a fragile stick to ward of “any tiger attacks in case they were any lurking ever around”. The climb was steep and what appeared to be close by from the lodge became ever elusive. But after few hours we reached our goal, dead tired.

Having played enough in the snow we decided to come down to our lodge. We were quite relaxed as now it was going to be down hill. When we actually started moving down we felt being pulled down by gravity and no much effort was required as while climbing. It seemed very easy in fact too easy to be true. In the beginning the descent was easy we moved down with speed. The mountainous slope was steep and slight imbalance could set you on a roll to the bottom of the small gorge in front of us and the consequence was not difficult to imagine. Most of us who tried to move down fast soon realized that it became uncontrollable due to laws of nature (gravitational pull) and you could easily become a body hurtling downhill uncontrollably and catching momentum. **Inderjit Arora (J-40)** was my desk mate in the class and we were together on this trip. He is a short dark fellow with whitest of teeth, humorous and grinning most of the time, he was excellent company. However, when he was made Monitor and Prefect he would not tolerate indiscipline and had become somewhat arrogant or so we thought. This part of him came out during this trip. He boasted of running down hill. He was behind us but soon we saw him whizzing past us downhill in great hurry. His face, which was grinning initially soon turned pale and expressionless. We realized he was unable to stop himself and was hurtling down and did not at that moment know what to do. Soon his speed was more than probably the Olympic sprinters. We just saw him speed down with limbs flailing and within seconds we saw him rise a few feet from the ground and fall downhill.

He vanished behind a rock. The rest of us stopped in our tracks. We exchanged glances wondering if we had seen the last of **Inderjit**. Or if we did see him, the sight may not be pleasant. Our hearts stopped and then beat fast. Slowly we moved down to the rock with all sorts of thoughts in our minds and yet no one spoke.

On reaching the rock we found there was a small pit below it. **Inderjit** had luckily tripped on the rock and took a short flight like a missile and had landed in the pit. This broke his uncontrollable downhill movement. There in the pit we found **Inderjit** getting up unhurt, dusting himself and wearing a sheepish grin showing all his white teeth.

TEHELKA IN PPS / STORM IN A TEA CUP

During 1966 each class in PPS had two sections i.e. 'A' and 'B'. Section 'A' sat for Senior Cambridge/Indian School Certificate conducted by the Cambridge University while Section 'B' appeared from the Higher Secondary conducted by the Delhi University. Even in Section 'A' there were two streams i.e. Biology and Mathematics. Students could also opt for both Biology and Mathematics. Surgeon **Cdr P.S. Lamba (Retd.) (B-89)** the school record holder of six points had both Biology and Mathematics and scored one Point each in both the subjects. There was always a stiff and healthy competition between Biology and Mathematics streams.

In Nov 1966, prior to the laboratory test for Biology, it was rumoured that the Biology stream had already been told the practical subject by the Biology teacher **Mr. K.K. Katyal (KKK)**. Mathematics students were not the ones to take lying down supposedly unfair advantage accrued by the Biology students hence decided to act.

During one of our informal Football matches (played with a Tennis ball) between Beas and Jamuna Houses in the years 1960-61 in the Quadrangular Courtyard in the Main Building (Kairon Block) where **Mr. Y.P. Bhardwaj**, our History teacher was also present. The talk amongst us veered to the desirable emblem for our school. My mind flashed to the label on the well-known beer brand “The Golden Eagle”. Fortunately, I was also able to fish out an empty bottle of the beer and hand it over to **Mr. Y.P. Bhardwaj**.

Mr. Y.P. Bhardwaj must have approved of the idea because he further handed over the bottle to **Mr. O.P. Bhatnagar**, our Hindi teacher and my House Master (also a versatile artist) virtually a master of all trades i.e. arts, crafts, games etc.

The Eagle painted by **Mr. O.P. Bhatnagar** was finally approved by the School authorities as the School emblem. If I remember correctly **Brig. Budh Prakash Singh (J-38)**, **Brig. Sureshwar Tiwari (J-34)** and **Col. (Dr.) Hoshier Singh Gill (Ex Jamuna)** were also witnesses to this great event. The “Eagle” today in its majestic flight is conquering newer heights amongst Nabhaites. As the saying goes “from tiny acorns grow mighty oaks”.

Remembering Tarif & Lali

A few weeks back a call from **Baljeet Mohil (J-128)** late in the evening left me badly shaken up. He informed me of the sad demise of two of my batch mates **Tarif Singh (J-53)** and **Lalinder Singh Dhindsa (B-52)**. We had entered together the portals of Junior

School in February 1961. Ours was the first batch, which had an Entrance Test for class V level. Our batch passed out in 1967.

Tarif Singh (J-53) was a Jat from the heart land of Haryana (Bhiwani). Soon he outgrew us into a tall and tough character. He excelled in all sports. Some of his records in Athletics stood for years (I believe 110m Hurdles record still stands). He also became the School Head Boy (1968). Studies were not his forte; he fell behind by one year and could not make it through the written tests of NDA. Undeterred he joined the other ranks in the Indian Navy. He played Hockey for the Indian Navy. He quickly rose up the ranks because of his excellence in Sports and Leadership qualities.

Lalinder Singh Dhindsa (B-52) (Lali) was the opposite of **Tarif** in physical terms. He was small, frail and with a soft voice. He was very neat in his work. His Geometry Box had all the essential ingredients of a good student. He had the latest expensive brands of pencils, pens, colours, rubbers, sharpeners etc. He was in the Medical stream and later went on to graduate in Agricultural Engineering from PAU. After this he went on to do MBA from IIM, Ahmedabad, the premier Management Institute of India (I don't know of any other ON who may have studied there). He was the only expert in India at that time who was an MBA with specialization in Pesticides. He was offered a senior job directly in Rallis India. His next job within few years was North Zonal Manager of Cynamid India, an MNC. Later, he started his own successful pesticides business. His younger brother **Palinder Singh Dhindsa** was also an Old Nabhaite who joined the Air Force and was martyred in air crash. What a loss, it has been to ONA fraternity and their mother.
