# Pleasant Memories and act of bravery

Thank you very much for your email. It is a pleasure to be writing to S-52! I was S-32! Brings back many pleasant memories.

I had googled "Old Nabhaites Association" and <a href="www.ppsona.com">www.ppsona.com</a> was listed amongst other sites. However, there was a warning that "this site can damage your computer." Do you know what that is about? I would like to get on the site but I get so much of spam that I have changed my email service from <a href="cox.net">cox.net</a> to <a href="mail.com">gmail.com</a>. Gmail definitely has better filters. This message is coming to you on my gmail account. In case you are planning a trip to the USA, we hope you will put Norman, Oklahoma on your itinerary. We are in the middle of the country and this city is fairly representative of the mid-western, southern part.

Sorry, I could not get back to you earlier. Have been busy with a few things. Unfortunately, we lost our sister in May after a two-month illness during which she was in and out of ICU. Her name was **Indra**. **She was the first girl to enroll at PPS and her house-number was S-33**. I remember we used to cajole her into doing a bharatnatyam dance for the Sutlej House drama programme.

Our father, **Dr. Surjit Singh**, was the first Senior Master of PPS. He was on deputation from the Punjab Education Service and his last appointment was Principal, Sports College, Jullundur, from 1972-74. He passed away in Oklahoma City in December 2003.

I am sending a cheque for Rs. 10,000 for ONA to your address. Great site- thanks for making it possible. Regarding the **sinking of the Khukri**- I was a sub-lieutenant then. The Fourteenth Frigate Squadron had been dispatched for hunter-killer operations to patrol the northern approaches to Mumbai harbour. Khukri, Kuthar, Kirpan were proceeding in formation about thirty miles west of Diu Head when Khukri was struck by a torpedo. It hit us in the engine-room area, close to the ship's magazine. The resulting explosions must have torn some good-sized holes in the ship's side because we took on water very fast. Also, the entire after half of the ship caught fire. We had lost electrical power within a few seconds of the torpedo hitting us. Captain Mulla gave orders to abandon ship about a minute after we had been hit. It was a dark night. Everything had happened very fast and some sailors were standing by the shipside, reluctant to go into the water. We had not had a chance to lower the boats or slip the life-rafts. He urged them to get into the water. On hindsight, Mulla-sahib assessed the situation rapidly and gave his orders in quick succession. He had probably run this scenario through his mind a number of times when he planned for various contigencies that the vessel might face. He knew what to expect if the Khukri took a hit in the engine and boiler-room areas. I am sure that he had also decided then that he would go down with his vessel if it was stricken.

I left the vessel within half a minute of the order to abandon ship. My side of the ship was already in the water by then. I just swam into the sea, taking care to see that I did not get entangled in the guard-rails. I swam away from the ship as fast as I could. Within two minutes of my leaving the ship, it sank below the waves. Some liferafts were automatically released from the ship when it sank to a pre-set depth. I was able to help some of my ship-mates on to these. We spent the night in an overloaded life-raft. The next morning we were picked up by Katchall.

We had lost many good and brave men that night, starting with Mulla-sahib.

PPS' middle name "Public" was rather forced on it and so, some ways, it was a "default option". PPS, soon after inception, had to change its name from Sainik School. As a great tribute to the fledgling institution for being given the honour of official Govt. of India's recognition as the role model for the large number of Sainik Schools soon to be established in whole of the country, the first and trailblazing Sainik School, Nabha adopted the new name of Punjab Public School.

Since PPS did not consciously adopt the name "Public", it meant that it did not follow the historical public schools connotation. "Public" schools, in England and also in India, before PPS, essentially meant schools for grooming upper class students to become future rulers/ public administrators.

PPS was all this and, also, much more . It was truly "public". Its prime objective was to produce top class students who would serve the public and their country in all aspects of life. But, for the first time in history of public schools in the British Commonwealth, the gates were also opened to children of general public and not limited to children of the privileged classes.

So, PPS can take genuine pride in being an institution which produced leaders of the public from children belonging to ordinary Indian public.

Thus, the mindset and aims of the Founders of PPS were similar to that of Mahatma Gandhi. The Mahatma on his return from South Africa changed the Indian National Movement from that of an exclusive body of privileged classes to a mass movement encompassing the entire nation.

Hence, PPS embodies the true spirit and aspirations of a free India where opportunities are available to all.

I am leaving for an extended trip to Canada, so I am giving the answers below to the best extent possible. I took the Indian School Certificate examination in December 1966. I generally did well in class and was third, behind **P S Lamba** (Beas, 1966) and Jaspal Chatha(R-89, 1966). My Indian School Certificate results were also along the same lines. **P S Lamba** (Beas) was 1st, Chatha(R-89) was 2nd and I was 3rd. I had 12 points. I went on to the Birla Institute of Technology & Science, Pilani to study Electrical Engineering. I was there from 1967 to 1972 and graduated with a B. E. (Hons) in Electrical Engineering with 71.5% marks. After Pilani, I was at Faculty of Management Studies (FMS), University of Delhi from 1972 to 1974 and obtained an MBA with 68.3%. Later my employers (Larsen & Toubro Limited and Det Norske Veritas) sent me for residential Senior Management Programmes at Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad (IIM, A), IMD, Lausanne, and INSEAD, Fontainebleau.

I joined the School Band when it was formed and played the bagpipes. I was the "leading piper" and was given the band prize in 1966.

I was the **first Indian and only the second Asian in Det Norske Veritas** to reach the level of a Director for a geographical area (Director - Middle East, India, South-East Asia, ANZ) and the Senior Management Group of the company.

I am now a Director on the board of directors of Hitachi Home & Life Solutions (India) Ltd, I am Director of Strategic Resources, my own management consultancy company, and am a visiting faculty at BITS, Pilani. Recent photograph is attached. I will try to locate an old photograph. Possibly there may be one in the school archive from Founders' Day 1966. I won the Band Prize in 1966.

I had a great time in school; learnt a lot and made good friendships.

## Wealthy Thoughts and a Very Lucky Person





After passing out from PPS I joined the Pre-medical course in DAV College Amritsar and then joined the Medical College, Amritsar in July 1976. I completed my MBBS course in December 1981 which included one year internship.

Thereafter I did one year's House Job in Ophthalmology in 1982 and completed my DOMS in 1984 which was also a year of great turbulance in Punjab.

I joined PCMS in 1984 and served for five years in rural areas. The experience in villages was a humbling one and made me a little wiser about the needs of an average citizen living in a backward border area. Inspite of the odds and the obstacles I was able to perform eye surgery in the village and was respected and loved by the staff and the people there. After spending 5 years in PHC Lopoke, it was time to move on once again. I was offered a Fellowship in Vitreo-Retinal Fellowship in Sankara Nethralaya, Madras under Dr.SS Badrinath, and I jumped at the offer. This was an exposure to a whole new world. I joined the institution in Madras in February 1990 and exactly after one year after having completed my Fellowship, found myself on the Tamil Nadu Express headed for home on the 1st of February 1991. My only possessions being my books and the skills and knowledge I had acquired in Madras.

I reached Amritsar on the evening of the 3rd of February 1991 by train and was received by my wife Reena, my elder son Veer who was then 3 years old and my in-laws, at the railway station. I joined my brother Dr.Rajbir Singh in practice the next day. Ever since then, I have been in practice gaining experience, honing my skills, imparting those very skills that I gathered over the years to a younger generation of surgeons. I consider myself today as an average surgeon with average skills. If some people have benefitted by these skills, then I consider myself to be very lucky. Then the ultimate purpose of life, is to have a life of purpose.

As to the achievements, recognitions, awards and honours, I really can't think of any. However I consider myself to be extremely lucky and wealthy. **My true wealth** is the number of patients who have benefitted from my average surgical skills. Just like I was an average boy in PPS.Lucky to have a good robust health especially when I see so many sick people all around. Lucky to have a devoted and a loving wife like Reena, lucky to have normal healthy children. Lucky to have siblings who love and respect each other, and above all lucky to have a father who at the age of 93 years still leads an active life full of zest and energy.

However in the journey of life, I did acquire a few skills which you might find interesting. I was a qualified pilot with a Private Pilot's Licence for many years. The licence however is no longer valid. My wife has an intense dislike for flying. I learned German and am able to speak and write the language fairly well. I studied German privately and appeared for all my exams at the Goethe Institute in Delhi. I cleared my advanced level German in 2007.

Long distance running, as you know, I only started recently in 2007. My first marathon was in Hamburg in April 2008. This changed my perspective towards life as a whole. I ran my second marathon in September 2008 in Berlin and my first half-marathon in Delhi in November 2008.

As to my present status, I just happen to be a consultant in an eye hospital named after my grandfather Dr.Sohan Singh who was a well known eye surgeon of Punjab in pre-partition India. We have patients also coming in from Uzbekistan and Nigeria, so that we sometimes have a very international surgical list. I and my colleague Dr.Vig have been several times to Lahore, Pakistan to attend the Lahore Ophthalmo, deliver lectures and to build bonds of frienship and also to learn from our Pakistani colleagues. We have also trained doctors from Uzbekistan and Pakistan and have developed deep bonds of friendship. To be continued, if you like the story.


# Farwell to Lt Gen TK Sapru (S-42, 1964)


# ONA Day "2K9" 12th April, 2009



#### **President's Address**

First I would like to welcome all Old Nabhaites to ONA Day 2K9 at the occasion of ONA fellowship.

In the year of Golden Jubilee, it may be worthwhile to reassess where ONA stands today and what can be done to take it further.

In the present phase of ONA which started in 1998 we have come a long way from starting point of almost a scratch. The achievements have been many

- Almost thirty Old Nabhaites discussed a draft of the constitution prepared by Col Tejinder(S-70, 1968) and Col SP Singh(R-84, 1968) at Ludhiana and adopted it.
- The body was registered by **Capt IS Dhami(R-257, 1976)** at Jalandhar under Punjab Societies Act 1860.
- A very successful "Rendezvous 2000" was held in style when Navin Talwar, Jashanjot and Kedarnath were at the helm.
- The address list has been built up from less than 100 to almost 3000.
- **The Eagle** was started in late nineties and is still being brought out to keep Old Nabhaites informed and motivated. It carries only positive attitude.
- Chapters of Nabha, Jalandhar, Chandigarh, Mohali, Patiala and Ludhiana participate in deliberations and decision making of ONA on and off.
- Website www.ppsona.com has been set up by ONA courtsey **Jimmy Singh(J-452,1982)** to keep ONs in touch and informed. It spells the future. We are grateful to him.
- Today from about 100 members we have strength of almost 1000 members- though still very short of target.
- Every year through sponsorships by few Ons, we provide awards and incentives worth over Rs1.25lacs to PPS students, teachers and *karamcharis*. In between too some needy students have been given financial help without disclosing names of the recipients.

• Except for last two years due to confusion of dates (April or October), ONA Day is held every year, with Old Nabhaites rather than school sharing the financial cost.

While achievements have been many there should be no hesitation in admitting failures.

The ONA has failed to **institutionalise** itself. Inspite of our best efforts we have not been able to get many chapters going with participation being limited to few. We are close to forming Bhatinda and Sangrur chapters which have large number of ONs. To take the organization further following steps are required

- 1. Each one of you Old Nabhaites must get involved in ONA by yourself. Nobody will come to ask you.
- 2. All of you must become Life members. Those who are, should convince others to become one.
- 3. Local units of ONA should be formed by local ONs .Every district in Punjab must have a Chapter apart from one in Haryana, Himachal, Delhi, Defence and Girls as enshrined in the constitution.
- 4. The Chapters should meet at intervals and elect two representatives for ONA Executive.
- 5. The executive thus formed should act as parliament of ONA and by consensus, as established by Constitution, choose President, Secretary and other Office Bearers. This is a unique feature of ONA as very few can participate in a General Body Meeting, due to distances and time constraints and professional commitments.
- 6. The ONA must then find ways to add inputs to PPS and its students through various talks, workshops and projects undertaken in PPS.
- 7. Finally, if we want PPS to be considered **Number One School of Punjab**, we have to provide leadership in social causes. This organization should be the flag bearer in Punjab and get involved in public issues which are strictly non-political. These issues could be related to environment, health or education. The PPS and ONA must play a leading role in these areas to be labelled the best school in Punjab. Officers, doctors and engineers are okay, but social & environmental leaders and writers and artists should also be products of this great school.
- 8. You must contribute to and build up the **ONA Benevolent fund**, the guidelines for which are laid. This fund can be used for all the noble objectives of ONA while Life Membership fee can be used for running ONA. The two have a distinct role to play from each other.

I would like to end with these thoughts and I hope I have stimulated you enough to get involved in ONA.

I wish you to enjoy the evening and I welcome Batch of 1984 pass outs who are here since it is there silver jubilee and wish them good luck! A happy Baisakhi to all of YOU!

### Secretary's Report (April 12, 2009)

This year, as in previous years, the ONA has continued to progress further, apart from consolidating its previous achievements.

1. We had mandatory meetings of the Executive Committee during the year

- 2. I welcome school passouts of 2008 who became Llife members of ONA to the fold. We are grateful to Comdr IL Sayal for it. Similarly 14 NRI life members and four others who became life members in 2008 are formally welcomed today.
- 3. A Grand Pre Christmas Dinner function was held in Chandigrah on 12 Dec 2008 to promote ONA Association.
- 4. PPS Golf competition was held in Chandi Mandir on 25th Jan with Chandigrah golfers and Lt Gen TK Sapru(S-43,1964) being the force behind it. The experiment was a big success in promoting fellow ship across batches, golf being the common factor. Similar efforts maybe made in other areas too.
- 5. Thanks to **Jimmy Singh (J-452)**, the website <u>www.ppsona.com</u> is functioning well. However we are still trying to rectify errors that have crept in. One project is a new website.
- 6. The Eagle has been brought out off and on to keep the ONs informed.
- 7. This year the ONA has awarded scholarships worth Rupees **Seventy Thousand** to merit students of class IV to Xth, courtesy **Dr Rupinder Brar (S-299).**
- 8. This year also the ONA awarded "The ONA late KK Katyal Memorial Award" a cash prize for deserving *karamcharis* of PPS worth a total of Rs 10000/ in memory of late Biology teacher Mr KK Katyal. It has been made possible courtesy ONs Vandana(R-344, 1978), Archana(R-307,1978) and Puneet(R-425,1981) children of Mr Katyal.
- 9. Creative writing workshop will be held soon. Money for getting an expert for it has been received by School. It has been donated by **ON Dr Preetam Singh(J-242,1973)** of Amritsar.
- 10. Sandeep(R-512, 1986) and Puneeta Sandhu(J-540,1987), in the memory of Sandeep's father, gave prize money of Rs 10,000 for the most improved child with rural background.
- 11. Best Teacher award of Rs 10, 000 for Junior and Senior School sections was donated by **ON Gurkiran Singh Dhillon(J-735,1990)** in the name of his uncle **Sardar Sukhbir Singh Cheema** who was instrumental in putting him into PPS.
- 12. Award of Rs 5000 each was given to best all round girl and boy for activities other than sports donated by **Harvinder Singh Dhaliwal(B-627,1988) Jt. Secy, ONA.**
- 13. I am grateful to all ONs who have donated for a good cause. In future we plan to raise funds for scholarships in PPS. Anyone of you wanting to honour someone in the family can do so by starting a scholarship in his or her name. There is no better way to pay back to PPS than by helping some bright students. For this a beginning has been made by floating the **ONA Benevolent Fund.** It was officially announced two years back and is part of our payback to PPS.
- 14. I request anyone of you who is not a member of ONA to become one today and take advantage of the ONA Day concessional fee for the same.
- 15. We want more members to be involved in running ONA by becoming executive members from different Districts. They should activate their district chapters. If there are any volunteers please come forward and offer yourself. We want to dedicate the next year to increasing Life Membership and involvement of ONs in running ONA from different areas of the state.

I would like to thank all of you for having come to attend this meeting and ONA Day. I will end by saying become a Life Member if you are not. The ONA runs on these funds. Please donate as much as you can for the ONA benevolent Fund to start scholarships and other projects in PPS. This is the only way we can show our gratitude to PPS.

# **ONA Life Membership**

The ONA is presently being run with the efforts of a few Old Nabhaites working voluntarily. Since no money has been taken for basic running of PPS by **Dr Jashanjot**, there has been no expenditure of ONA for last two years. However, we have to pay expenses of hard copy of two issues of The Eagle and ONA day this year.

We have crossed the basic stage. The next step should be to have a strong vibrant ONA run efficiently for future. For this, we need funds so as to build a strong organizational set-up and infrastructure. This requires an office of our own, maybe in Chandigarh, which can be the hub. The office should be well equipped with computers and good communications set-up, including tele-link and Internet connection. We need regular running of *The Eagle* and *the Website* so that these do not fail even if there is no one to take responsibility. We need at least two or three regular employees who can maintain records, update databank on specific software, receive and file mail and send out replies or information. Also needed is an accountant to keep accounts and file tax returns every year in consultation with a Chartered Accountant. He should also send out balance sheet to all members every year. Even postage cost is enormous.

This set-up of quality may require few lakh rupees every year as running costs. The money for running ONA comes from interest on the life membership fee kept as a corpus FD by ONA in a Nationalized or recognized Bank. At present we have less than 1000 members who have in the past paid from Rs300 -1000 only as life membership, giving a total amount of only Rupees 15 lakhs raised in 46 years. The target should be at least a crore if we are to come near any other organization of similar nature from established public schools. ONA should not have to depend on individual sponsorships for the sake of its self esteem.

There are more than 4000 Old Nabhaites. We need at least 3500 members who can pay Rs1500 (Indian residents) and Rs 5000 (Non Resident Indians) each to build a large corpus. By just enrolling 1000 more members at Rs 2000 we could easily up our kitty by Rs 20 lacs. Would we then need to depend on any one individual? So play your role in ONA. Strengthen it by becoming a Life Member today. If you are not sure of your membership status, write to us and confirm your membership. Membership of local old Chapter does not always mean you are member of the Main Body. Certain advantages will accrue only to Life Members in future.
