LETTER AND SPIRIT OF ONA.

Old Nabhaites Association (ONA) is as old as the pioneer batch (1964). It was resolved in the first meeting that old students of PPS would be called Old Nabhaites and their association, Old Nabhaites Association (ONA). In the initial years, ONA activity was limited to an annual ONA Day, one day prior to the Founders' Day, consisting of a friendly match and a dinner, ONs kept in touch with each other through the Chronicle. By the early 1980s, the ONA family had grown sizably and many ONs had settled down to their chosen vocations. Initiative was taken by Dr. Jashanjot Singh (S-52) to develop ONA into a closely knit and vibrant organisation.

He collected addresses of ONs from Bursar's last bill mailing addresses and the first 'Eagle' was launched. What galvanised every body was when ONs learnt that our founder Head-master, Mr. J.K.Kate had developed a serious heart trouble necessitating immediate surgery possible only in the U.S.A. It was well known that Mr. Kate had devoted his entire life in the selfless pursuit of creating Institutions and better students and personal funds would be a constraint in his treatment.

ONA rose to the occasion displaying its newly attained strength and maturity. Repaying their benefactor in the manner he had always functioned, ONs went on a massive collective fund raising drive.

Baljit Mohil (J-128) made arrangements with Air India for travel, Jaspal Chatha (R-89) kept an ambulance ready at the New York Airport where Mr. Kate had to change planes enroute Milwaukee. Darshan Dhaliwal (Ex-Sutlej of Rakhra) received Mr. Kate at Milwaukee and looked after him through out his stay.

The entire ONA fraternity can justifiably feel proud of this unprecedented spontaneous collective display of gratitude. affection and respect towards their Founder Head master.

Nothing portrays this glorious spirit of ONA better than the letter written to **Dr. Jashanjot** by **Vilas Kate** (Ex Sutlej) after **Mr. Kate**'s death. We reprint the same.
