WHILE WE WERE BOYS IN SCHOOL

Share and Share Alike

Miss G.B. Malkani was a spinster from Maharashtra, handpicked by Mr. J.K. Kate to run the Junior School. For years she headed the Junior School, turning raw village and small town boys into disciplined and well behaved "gentleman boys". Anyone who has been through her care will stand apart.

She can also be called "The Lady in White" because that was the colour of saree she always wore. She was a picture of total dedication. Not only were her clothes white but also her spirit must have been pure white if they have any colours. She carried a lamp at night after "lights out" to see that everything was in order. She did not put on the lights lest she disturb sleeping children. The boys in Junior School must have learnt many lessons from her, one of them, indirectly, was how well she looked after her aged parents. She was an excellent teacher and her students must be writing in Mary and Richardson style that she taught. If Florence Nightingale could have had a reincarnation as a teacher it could easily have been Miss G.B. Malkani.

She was dead against wastage of any kind. She also wanted all children to live like a family. The whole House collectively bought hair oil and toothpaste. It was stored in one cupboard by the Housemistress, who would distribute the oil on Sundays to everybody for personal use. The toothpaste was personally planted on the toothbrush by the Housemistress standing at the entrance to the bathroom. To prevent wastage only half the brush was covered by paste. This way the House in-charge also knew who brushed regularly and who did not. Apart from mornings children were expected to brush after meals (Lunch and Supper) but without toothpaste.

Many boys after holidays brought eatables to school. Children from Jat families like myself would bring ghee and "Panjiri" to make us strong. However, these were no match for the different delicacies and sweets brought by town boys like **NavinTalwar** (S-71). Whenever he opened his box the other boys would look expectantly into it from the corner of their eyes.

Miss Malkani's sixth sense saw through these feelings. She would put eatables of all boys in a common cupboard. All the boys of the House shared this whether they contributed to it or not. The Housemistress would give equal quantity to everyone on fixed days (usually Sundays). The ghee was put on the Dining tables to be shared by all the Housemates. Is there a better way to teach the spirit of Share and Share Alike?

In the 1974 I.S.C results, in his very first Batch, **Mr. Tandon's** History Deptt. produced the best result among all subjects (Arts & Sciences). **Mr. Tandon** had not only taught History, he, also, created History in the academic records of P.P.S.

WHERE EAGLES DARE

Wg. Cdr. Bikram Dev Singh (S-84) was decorated with SHAURYA CHAKRA on the Republic Day, 1983. We feel immensely proud in printing this Brave Nabhaite's Citation (President's Secretariat Notification):

"On the 24th June, 1982, information was received about 19 Army Personnel having been stranded near INDRAJOT PASS, north of Dharmshala. A rescue aircraft was launched and it was found that the personnel were on a rock at a height of 14500 ft and on the mountainside with a gradient of 75°. The personnel were surrounded by about 10 feet of fresh snow. It was appreciated that no landing could be attempted and that winching operations will be required to rescue the personnel. Food, medicine and blankets were dropped at the site and the aircraft returned to base late in the evening. On the 25th June 1982, **Flight Lieutenant Bikram Dev Singh**, Flying (Pilot) was detailed to commence rescue operations in Cheetah Helicopter fitted with rescue hoist. He reached the site at 0900 hrs. The weather at that time was fair but the wind speeds were of the order of about

40 knots. After a thorough recce the aircraft was brought to hover about 15 ft. above the stranded personnel. Because of the steep incline and location of the personnel, the aircraft had to be hovered leaving very small margin between the rotor and cliff side. Hovering under such conditions of high altitude, strong winds and very difficult terrain, is a nightmarish task requiring exceptional skill. The helper was lowered at the site and two army personnel were hoisted up and taken to YOL. On returning to the site, it was found that the weather had sharply deteriorated. Clouds had rolled in over the area, the visibility had dropped to 100 metres and the wind speed had picked up to about 50 to 55 knots. In spite of this Flt. Lt. Bikram Dev Singh continued the rescue operations with cool professionalism and in two more trips evacuated in all six personnel. By 1730 hours all stranded personnel had been brought to YOL.

Fit. Lt. Bikram Dev Singh thus displayed courage, a high degree of professional skill, competence and devotion to duty of an exceptional order."
