### (ARTICLE III-MEMBERSHIP)

# THE HEADMASTER SPEAKS

There is a lot of curiosity among the ONs to know about the present state of affairs of the school as is borne out from their letters, which have now begun to pour in. So we decided to know about the school and also introduce the Headmaster to the ONs.

Dr. J. J. Singh (S-52) and Mr. S. S. Ahluwalia (J-19) interviewed Gp. Capt. Grewal on May 6, 1983. Some excerpts;

The headmaster Gp. Capt. A.J.S. Grewal is the first serviceman to become H.M. of PPS. He was born in Kila Raipur near Ludhiana and is an alumni of Govt College for men, Ludhiana having done his M.A. in English from there. He has also done Diploma in journalism.

He was selected for Air Force and I.P.S. but in his days Air force was more attractive. He was in the logistics side. He has been on deputation to the Indian High Commission in U.K. for 4 yrs. He is an avid mountaineer having been associated with the 1st Indian team that attempted Mt. Everest from the west. He is an outdoor man with love of nature. That is why mountaineering and tree plantation are very active hobbies in the school. No doubt he is a fellow of Royal Geographical Society, London and member of various mountaineering clubs and associations,

His experience in running institutes like HMI, Darjeeling & Nehru Institute of Mountaineering, Uttarkashi & being a member of governing board of St. Paul's, Darjeeling should help him in running PPS well which is actually the first school he is running.

Unlike Public School H.M.s and Ex-Serviceman, he is informally dressed in office. He is short, and stocky. Although a mountaineer he likes to carry a cane for walks. He is fond of dogs and has brought up pedigree Tibetan dogs which have won various competitions in dog shows. During the interview printed later in this issue, he was very informal.

J.J. What is the present admission policy of the school?

H.M. We follow the same admission policy as is followed by most of the Public Schools. Every year an advertisement is put in the major dailies of the country announcing the admission test. A merit list on the basis of the test is prepared, 25% seats are for scholars of Punjab, Harayana and the Central Government,

J.J. What about preference to ONs? Do you have seats reserved for the wards of ONs?

- H.M. There are no reservations but there have been no problems as yet. The children of the ONs normally have achieved certain standard of education and they, by and large clear our test for admission.
- J.J. Why not have reservations for them in ture ?
- H.M. I think there is no need for that yet. The headmaster should be given discretionary powers in this regard. We do give preference to blood relations of ONs. After few years when many wards of ONs start applying we may need reservations as in some of the other Public Schools.
- J.J. The Schools results are not as good as they can be. What are the reasons ?
- H.M. The results have begun to improve now. The school went through a bad patch immediately before I joined but now the things are looking up. We had 100% pass results with 60% 1st divisions in I.S.C. last year even in I.C.S.E. there were only four failures
- S.S. Acedemic results alone are not real indicators of a school's progress. We have noticed that many of the very talented boys who showed great promise, both in sports and acedemics just didn't make it anywhere to the top.
- H.M. You are right to an extent. But now we are doing our bit to help students, find their way in a more planned manner. We lay more emphasis on career planning. We have even got a special cell for this purpose.
- S.S. Does it function ?
- H.M. We will make it function. Though we have our own problems. The 10+2 system has not come to stay in Punjab. So the boys want to leave after the Xth class. Only the scholars remain in XIth and XIIth. So first when we can give direction to their careers, they are not with us. The teachers become quite helpless in such a situation.
- J.J. I think the ONs can be of help in advising class X & XII boys in the various careers open to them and how to approach them. What are you doing to get good teachers ? It is no longer a very attractive profession.
- H.M. First thing, I have helped raise their emoluments and given more facilities. I have also tried to get teachers from all over India. For this purpose I advertised in all the big papers of the country and try to attract the best talent. I even arranged to interview candidates in Delhi & Chandigarh.
- S.S. A little while ago you were talking about raising standards and planning careers. What steps have you really taken ?
- H.M. As I said, we have a career planning cell to guide students and spot talent. This year, I have introduced arts subjects as an option. We plan to have an Automobile Engg work shop, where we plan to buy junk Jeeps. The students will be encouraged to tinker with them and probably also learn to drive. We propose to send boys and girls for trekking, adventure courses and introduce B.B.C. Courses in Phonetics and so on. Of special mention is that we sent a boys' expedition to the Himalayas and we are the 1st school in Punjab to do so and the fourth in India.
- J.J. What problems did you face when you joined ?
- H.M. Frankly the school was a disturbed hornet's nest when I joined. If I had known half the truth I wouldn't have joined. The discipline was non-existent. The students and some of the teachers had vitiated the whole atmosphere. I had never heard of strikes, and demonstrations by students and teachers in Public schools and for no reason whatsoever.
- S.S. What steps did you take and what was their outcome ?
- H.M. Well I believe in basic goodness of human nature. I called in the boys and the teachers together and had a face & frank discussion with them. I discussed their problems and acted firmly on whatever decisions taken. I was resolved to maintain discipline and told every one unequivocally. Soon the things began to straighten out. I had to sack eleven senior boys and all teachers with doubtful credentials within a year. With the help of the boys and the staff, I could get things right again.
- J.J. What are your present problems ?
- H.M. Well ! None that can't be really tackled.
- S.S. You mean things are exactly as they ideally ought to be ?
- H.M. The problem, if you can call it that, is to improve our standards in all fields. The standard of games, studies, cultural activities have to be improved. We hope to consolidate on our past achievements. We have chalked out plans like making the boys play one main game through-out the year instead of making all the boys play all the games. Special committees have been constituted to help boys and girls discover and develop their histrionic and artistic talent.
- J.B. You are having same infra-structural improvement for these activities ?
- H.M. Yes, in the silver jubilee year we are building a Squash court, and two Tennis courts. We plan to develop a drama troupe and hope to produce a Greek tragedy which will tour the major cultural centres of the country.

S.S. Is there anything you would like to mention for the information of the O. Ns.

H.M. Yes, I would like than to know that I have tried to remove all the red areas like the poultry shed and have under taken projects which would help generate funds for the school. 15000 Euclyptus trees have been planted and many more will be planted this year. The school campus now has gorgeous new look. A beautiful rose garden has come up and I take special interest in the beautification of the campus.

J.J. How about giving some monetary help to the O.N.A. ?

H.M. Oh : I thought the O.N.A. would come out and help the school financially to develop some new projects. Any way, we will consider helping the O.N.A. if we can, and if we really must.

J.J. What kind of help would you like from ONA.

H.M. First you must get organised. I have some projects in mind like gymnasium and a computer cell which will require a computer. The ONs can help us by raising a part of the funds for these.

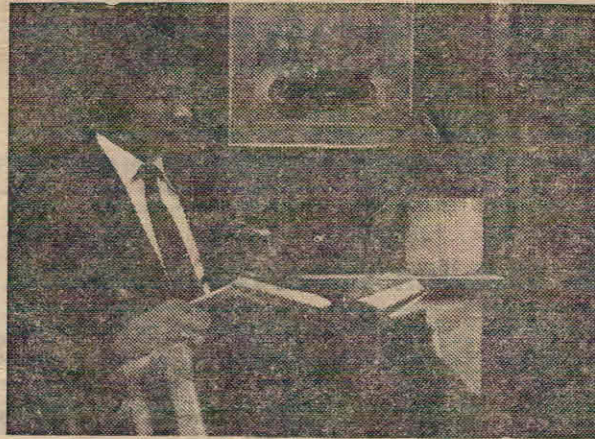
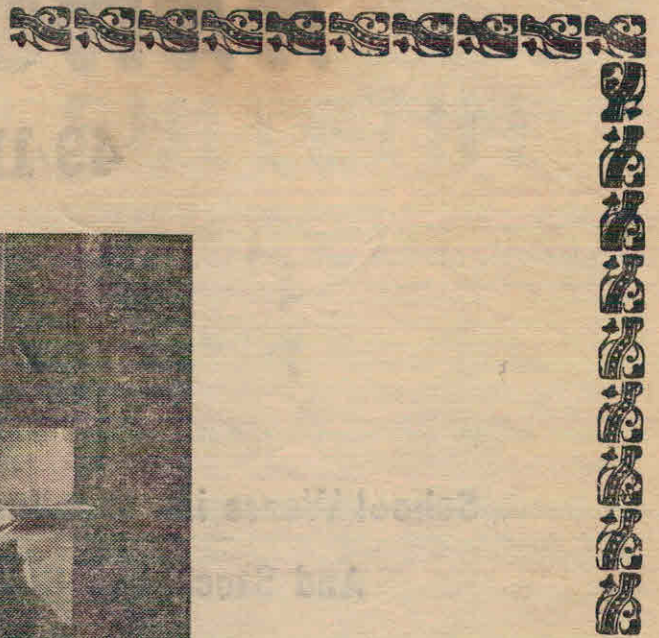
